


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Key Areas of Exploration

Methodology

- > Interview length 15 minutes
- > 8 Industry professionals interviewed in Bahrain


DESK RESEARCH

Bahrain Country Overview







Bahrain

As one of the smallest countries in the Middle East, Bahrain is an archipelago consisting of the main island Al Bahrayn and 30 smaller islands, all sitting off the east coast of Saud Arabia. It has the smallest population of the gulf states and is 90% urbanised with the capital Manama and Muharraq being the most populated cities.



Its people

The Bahrain population is skewed towards younger males. A strategy to attract international investment while reducing foreign workers has seen Bahrain seeking to increase the proportion of locals in the workforce. This has, however, been offset by increased voluntary retirement in the public sector.



Economy

Similar to the rest of the region, Bahrain's economy is largely linked to the price of oil. The recent slump in oil price has had less of an impact due to a relatively long-established diversified economy. However, it is this non-oil sector that has been hit hardest in 2020, particularly amongst industries related to travel and logistics.





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SELECTED PROJECT

Vision 2030 in Bahrain extends to environmental protection for which plastic usage is a major culprit.

Bahrain banned the usage of single-use plastic bags in July 2019. In 2020 the ban extended to the manufacturing of polythene and polypropylene sheets, primary component of plastic tableware.

- > Reduction of 300 tonnes of plastic waste per day in Bahrain
- > Bahrain factories allow the manufacture biodegradable plastic bags only
- > Reduction of 1 tonne of plastic saves 1.8 tonnes of oil
- > Estimated 100,000 marine animals saved annually in Bahrain due to the ban





Industry professionals' awareness:

Sustainability is widely understood by industry professionals; its impact and how it sits within society.



"Bahrain is working to fulfill its commitment towards the sustainable development goals adopted by the United Nations in 2015, including the seventh goal of ensuring universal access to clean and sustainable energy. The Kingdom has succeeded in ensuring universal access to energy sources, as 100% of the population benefits from services Electricity and water. So, they set the national renewable energy plan."

"It is about the sustainability of life, the environment we live in, the natural resources. Humans have a direct or an indirect impact on preserving the environment and affect it in a positive or negative way."

"It concerns the environmental effects on humanity, it works on minimizing the damage therefore it relies on renewable resources.





Bahrain has sustainable development goals outlined at a national level; As a small nation what opportunity is there for sport and events, we looked to understand how this has filtered down.

The tourism sector is a key revenue stream of the future and Bahrain needs to provide world class attractions to compete with its neighbours. Dive Bahrain was launched in 2019 and claims to be the world's largest underwater theme park – embracing sustainability as its core principle

- The dive site covers an area of 100,000 square metres and has a 70-metre long decommissioned Boeing 747 as its centre piece
- Preparing the aircraft for submersion included removing all possibly-toxic substances in order to preserve the marine environment.
- > All structures are all made of eco friendly, sustainable materials
- > The submerged attractions will allow coral reef growth and a habitat for marine life in the surrounding areas.
- The project also aims to provide researchers with information and data on marine ecology and hopes to raise awareness on the growing importance of preserving marine habitats



- Nearly 13 million tourists visited Bahrain in 2018
- While the majority arrive across King Fahad Causeway for a short visit only, Bahrain is eager to attract more international visitors

Leading by sustainable example:

Industry professionals' knowledge around sustainability ranges considerably – from well versed in international examples, to some confusion around local initiatives with many having none at all.

INTERNATIONAL EXAMPLE

"Some European football stadiums are environmentally transformed by installing seats made from recycled plastic, and in Amsterdam, fans bought old seats as souvenirs. The Pontedera City Stadium in Italy features plastic benches made from local waste. In England, the Forest Green Rovers club won the title of the greenest football club in the world after its success in operating its fields with solar energy and by recycling the water and providing a full vegetarian list for the players and fans.... Tokyo Olympics and the American Football League. All gold, silver and bronze medals are manufactured directly from old cell phones, computers and other recycled electronic waste."

"Bahrain started a campaign 'plastic is not fantastic' for recycling plastic waste in collaboration with the Supreme Council for the Environment and made the facilities responsible for spreading awareness in Bahrain."

"All who work in design of building and roads implement it, especially in the western countries. However, here, big companies implement it."

"The information center because it gives us information that are true, medical and modern. Information about the use of the sustainability services, spreading awareness.

I also see us going towards green houses that preserve the environment by using solar panels for example."

"There are events that implement sustainability practices, like recycling, in an NGO. They did a campaign 'Al Imam Zayn Alabidi' where they did many practices including recycling and the preservation of the environment and how we can recycle the wastes at home and reuse it."

Single use plastics:

There is creeping awareness of activity around the reduction of single-use plastic, specifically bags.

"Currently, for example, as I am seeing, they are using paper bags and recycled bags in the supermarket. I do not know whether they started implementing this here in the middle east or not.

In Europe and the United States, they already started implementing it, even though this is an old idea.

In the past, we used to have paper bags in the Arab countries; everything was made out of paper.... Now, they are going back to paper, but this time paper is recycled. Before, there was not any recycling."

"Bahrain has completed the first step regarding reducing the use of plastic, in all the facilities there are no fences except biodegradable ones. The second step will be completed within the two upcoming years and it will mainly focus on replacing plastic materials without adding any extra cost on the consumer.

The Supreme Council for the Environment aims through spreading awareness to shed the light on the negative effects of plastic waste on the recent and the future and encouraging them to reduce the use of plastic and using ecofriendly material Bahrain also implemented a law to preserve the environment."

"An initiative of sustainability practices is replacing single use plastic bags with other bags."

"Awareness is spreading when it comes to the use of plastic but there is no real execution of the elimination of plastic because there is no law for it."

"Reducing the use of plastics that are disastrous for the human environment and turning them into environmentally friendly materials... There are more than one event. They use paper instead of plastic.

It is even found in businesses; they use paper material instead of plastic. There are waste bins for sorting materials for recycling."

Sustainable initiatives in practice:

Some clear indications of sustainability being considered and implemented in Bahrain – though, some professionals claimed they were working with none.

", improving animal diversity, preserving natural resources, using products that would not harm natural resources, using processed water and using the best techniques. Informing the people in charge of their responsibility towards sustainability and encouraging them to do so."

Importance of sustainability:

Consistent agreement of the importance of sustainability in industry amongst our professionals.

"Of course it is, because it promotes growth and preserves the environment and promotes living in a healthy way. You could implement sustainability in sports and tourism.

In sports for example we can make use of the metro for transportation, and there should be trainers there to show them the way.

On an environmental scale we would be reducing the pollution and the use of gas by replacing it with solar energy."

"Yes of course. The UN works on implementing sustainability in sports for a healthy and safe lifestyle on the long run."

"Of course, it is very important. It would reduce the harm made from man all over the world and it affects climate change."

"Yes, it is very important. The practices that the humans do affect the environment negatively. It leads to the increase of carbon levels in the air. This effects the plants and increases global warming. In the long run, it will lead to the increase of temperature of Earth.

Therefore, the humans have a negative role so there is a responsibility on them to preserve the environment and its resources through sustainability."

Relevance of event size:

A general quiet consensus around the need for sustainability initiatives no matter the size. However, there is recognition of the efforts required and awareness larger events can bring.



Accreditation and measurement:

The majority of industry professionals had knowledge of ISO 20121 and for the most part do believe in the measurement of sustainability.



ISO 20121

"... the ideal starting point for any event is sustainability. It means managing the event so that you get more with fewer resources.

The ISO 20121 standard helps reduce your impact on the environment and local communities. It will also push performance to the maximum extent possible while achieving energy efficiency while obtaining the full support of all stakeholders.

The ISO 20121 standard has been specifically developed for the event organization to help keep sustainability a top priority when managing and organizing your events."

"Dubai Sports Council on the head of global governmental sports institutions was ISO certified for organizing and managing events in a sustainable way. It is the first governmental sports facility in the world to be certified as a reward for implementing measures and Its commitment to international quality standards."

"It is standard that works on a longterm vision for sustainability. It determines the methods that can be used to achieve the organization of goals and practices and define roles."

MEASUREMENT

"No I don't think there should be. It should be implemented because of awareness and not because it is forced."

"Yes of course, economic measurement, social measurement and environmental measurement.

(Benchmarks should differ)....Many resources found in a country are not found in another. Each country is different from others in terms of climate, temperature and means of transportation."

"Before measuring sustainability, it must be a cultural phenomenon in the society and people know about it, its importance, its goals and its process when we want to compare Bahrain, with its people, culture and its level of awareness of preserving the environment and the cleanliness of its streets, to the level of awareness of another country....

In Bahrain, the government might not do events related to sustainability. It might not have any programs, ads nor awareness campaigns, but the people maintain sustainability."



"It might be found here but it is not implemented.

Here, in the Arab countries, we have a problem, we have rules but three quarters of them are not implemented.

There has to be reinforcement on the rules that the government imposes."

Conclusions

A decent degree of awareness around sustainability and the position it should play in the future, particularly in sports and events.

- > General awareness and knowledge of Bahrain's Vision for sustainability, with some confusion on detail.
- > Some sustainable work remits already exist, largely at a non customer facing level (renewable energy, solar power)
- > Gradual awareness of the elimination of single-use plastic (from Government initiative to observation)
- > Little acknowledgement of what is required to achieve the vision from an industry point of view:
 - Understanding that Bahrain is 'ready' due to Government plans and initiatives
- > Some concern that unless the government actually impose laws, nothing will happen

Recommendations

Further down the diversification path than its neighbours, Bahrain has recently struggled financially. Will the investment in sustainable initiatives be the most pressing?

- > On a basic level, there is knowledge around why sustainability is important, though few initiatives appear to be top of mind
 - The recent ban on plastics needs to be communicated to reach the community
- > The connection between Vision 2030 and industry needs to be made more tangible and in evidence:
 - Requires guidance what does it mean to industry
 - Financial support will be crucial
- Consideration over law enforcement society and industry need to be pushed?
- > Events themselves should leverage their communication platforms to raise awareness and educate the population
 - Both in marketing around, pre and during events
 creating nudge behavioural practices along the way
